Y9 GCSE History trip to Berlin – Monday 04 July 2022 – Thursday 07 July 2022

The History Department are delighted to offer a four day/three night trip to Berlin during Challenge Week (from Monday 04 July to Thursday 07 July 2022). This will be a wonderful opportunity for our students to enhance their knowledge and understanding of the History GCSE. The itinerary for the trip will largely, but not exclusively, relate to the depth study of Germany (1918-39) and the Cold War (1945-91). The students will also experience other aspects of Berlin's rich history such as the Wall and the TV Tower. This trip is for students with a keen interest in taking History as one of their GCSE options.

Our package will include:

- Return airport transfers to Gatwick Airport
- Return flights between Gatwick and Berlin with BA. (Exact cost and times TBC)
- 1 item of hand luggage per person. Checked in luggage (if required) will be charged at a supplement of £35 per person. Please note this amount is subject to change at discretion of the airline. As we are staying only three nights, extra hand luggage is not necessary
- Return Airport Transfers in Berlin
- 3 nights' accommodation on a bed & breakfast basis
- 3 x evening meals in Berlin restaurants (evening meal at airport is not included)
- 4 x packed lunches (includes one to be picked up on arrival day at your accommodation)

Provisional itinerary (To be finalised nearer the time):

Day 1

- Half Day Walking Tour to include: Brandenburg Gate, Tiergarten, Holocaust Memorial, Checkpoint Charlie & Topography of Terror
- Evening meal

Day 2

- Guided Tours with coach hire
- Olympic Stadium
- Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp
- TV Tower and evening meal

Day 3

- Travel on underground
- Cold war Spy Museum
- Allied Museum guided tour
- Reichstag and evening meal

Day 4

- Travel on underground
- Holocaust memorial, Brandenburg Gate and shopping
- Berlin Wall 3D Panorama
- Coach to airport and travel home
- Arriving at school early evening

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Day 5 – Friday 08 July 2022 (in school)

A day of debriefing. We will have a look at our pictures and have a photo competition, a huge quiz, awards and lots of souvenirs for prizes.

A detailed timetable will be provided when we have secured the flight bookings (see below). The above itinerary is all inclusive except for a small fee for the visit to the TV Tower which we anticipate costing approximately 15 Euros. You are also advised to budget for a little extra pocket money for your child to buy food on the Thursday evening at the airport as this meal is not included in the package. We will be leaving for Berlin early on Monday morning and returning to Forest School on Thursday evening at a time to be confirmed.

Cost and payment

The airline does not release its flight schedule until November 2021. Therefore, the travel company are able to provide a provisional price for the trip. They have quoted us a <u>price of</u> **£560** for the tour, flights and hotel only, (this does not include the extras outlined above for city travel, pocket money etc). There could be a £30-£50 contingency depending on flight prices.

To secure the flights as early as possible we require a non-returnable deposit of **£100** by Friday 05 November 2021. If you wish for your child to be allowed to participate in the trip please complete the permission form attached and return it to Mrs Dougherty in the Main Office and pay the non-returnable deposit of **£100** via your child's Parentpay account by Friday 05 November 2021. Full payment must be made by Thursday 07 April 2022.

This is a residential activity taking place in Challenge Week in July when the regular timetable is suspended. There will be a charge for the trip totalling **£560** per student and payment should be made via your child's ParentPay account (<u>www.parentpay.com</u>). Participation in this trip is voluntary.

I would also like to remind you that we require medical information, emergency telephone numbers and passport details to be handed in to the office as soon as possible in order to the book Reichstag Tour which is very popular but has security regulations. It is essential therefore that your child has an up to date UK EHIC or UK GHIC (Health Insurance Card) - free to apply for online https://www.nhs.uk/using-the-nhs/healthcare-abroad/apply-for-a-free-uk-global-health-insurance-card-ghic/ as they will need to bring this with them on the trip.

I will write to you again with more details about this trip and information about payment once numbers have been confirmed.
