
Scrapbooks will be displayed at our 'Settling in Evening' in October for our parents, teachers and students to see.

Rusty Nail Science Investigation - page 1

Your challenge: An iron nail will rust (form iron oxide) when it is exposed to water and oxygen. This can be a real problem for iron objects such as gates which are left outside. Your challenge is to design and carry out an investigation into what conditions will cause an iron nail to rust the most.

Equipment: Glass jars/old glasses, iron nails, table salt, vegetable oil, kettle, rice

Risks: Care with boiling water and rusty nails



Method

1. Label five jars 1 to 5.

2. Add the following to each jar:

Jar	Condition	Contents
1	Air only	Iron nail
2	Water + Air	Iron nail, water half covering the nail
3	Sea Water + Air	Iron nail, salty water half covering the nail
4	Water only	Iron nail, boiled water fully covering the nail, oil layer on top
5	Dry Air only	Iron nail & few grains of dry rice to absorb water

- 3. Leave the nails for at least 4 days. Then record your observations in a table. This could include diagrams, photographs or you could use a rust scale (e.g. 0 = no rust to 10 = fully rusted)
- 4. Write up your investigation using the writing frame below.

Extension options: Research more about the chemistry of rust. How could you improve your experiment? What is galvanising?



Logo Design


